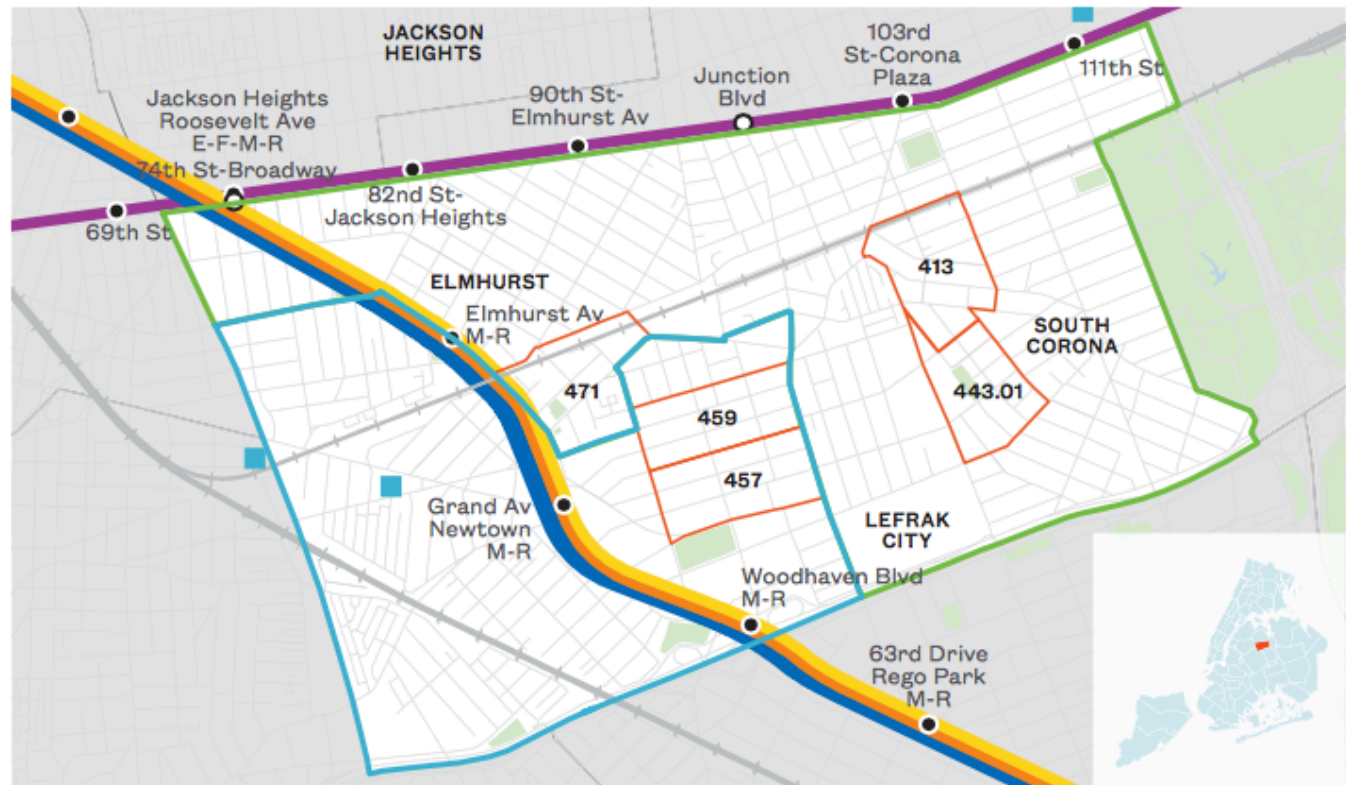

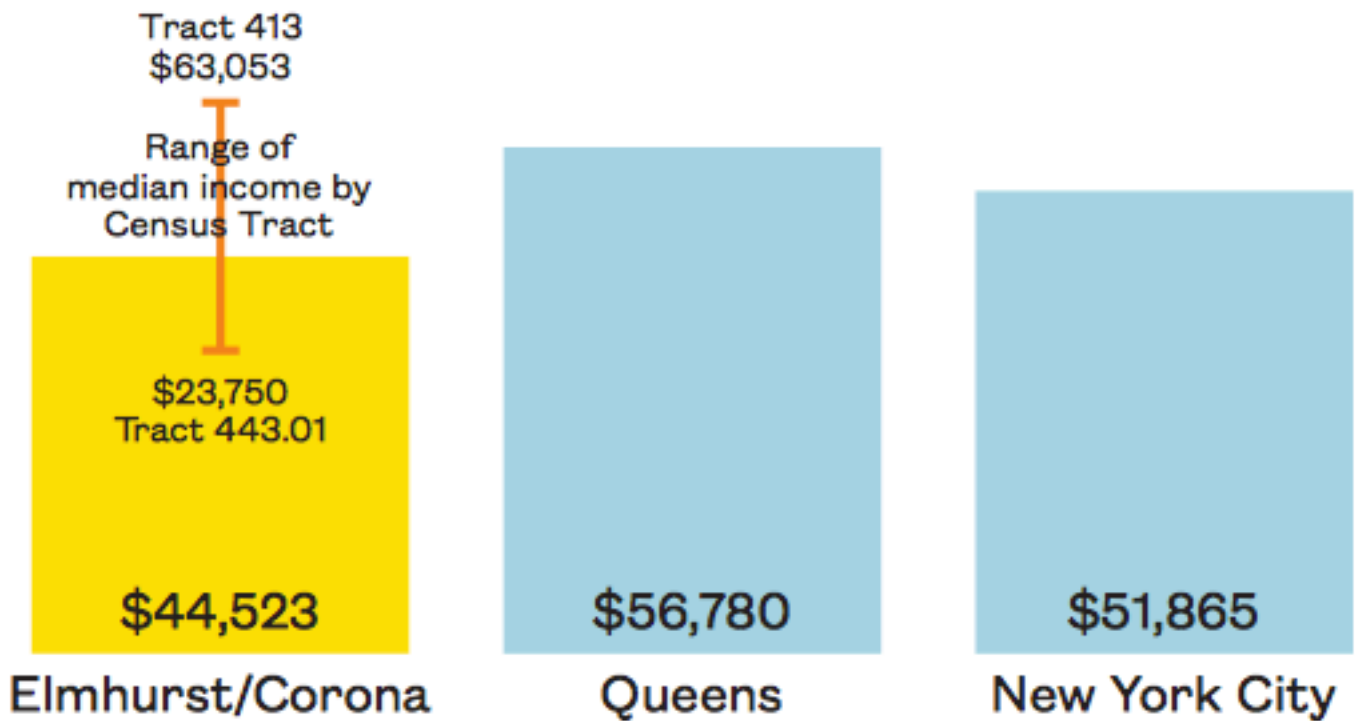

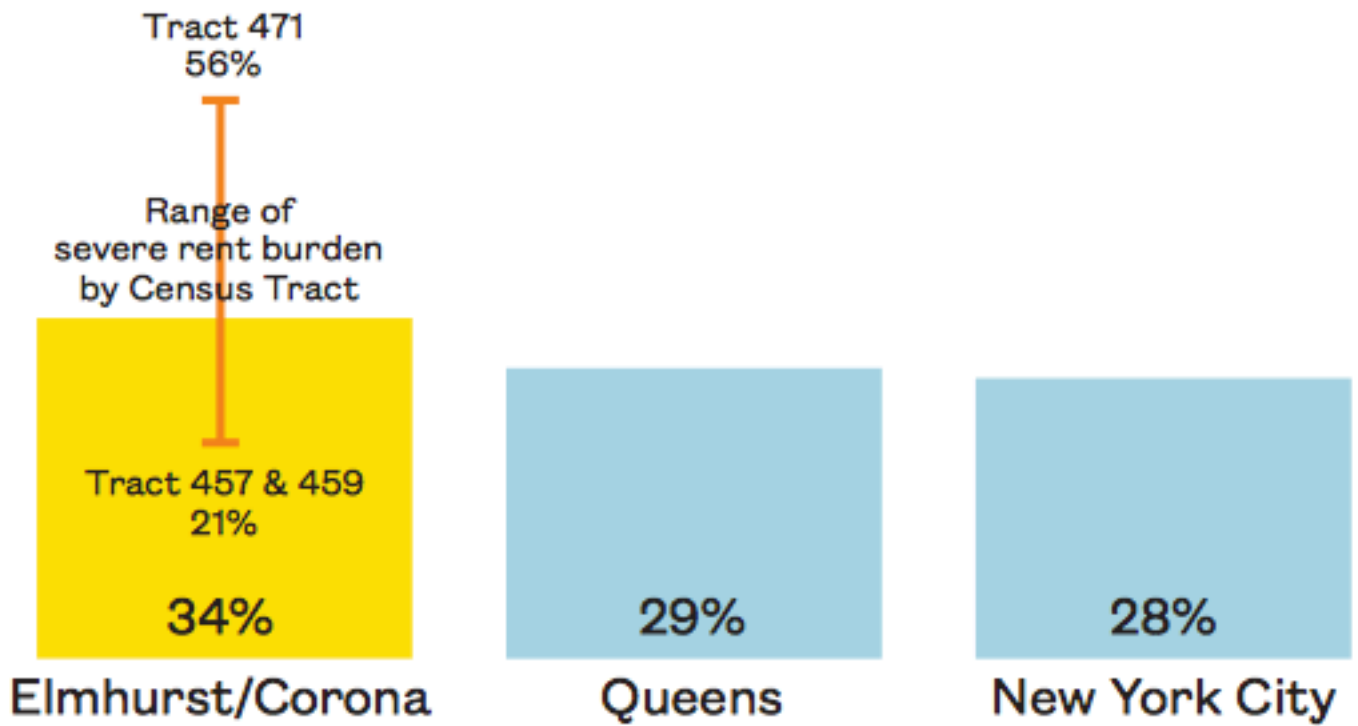

Rate of Severe Rent Burden (2008–2012 Average)



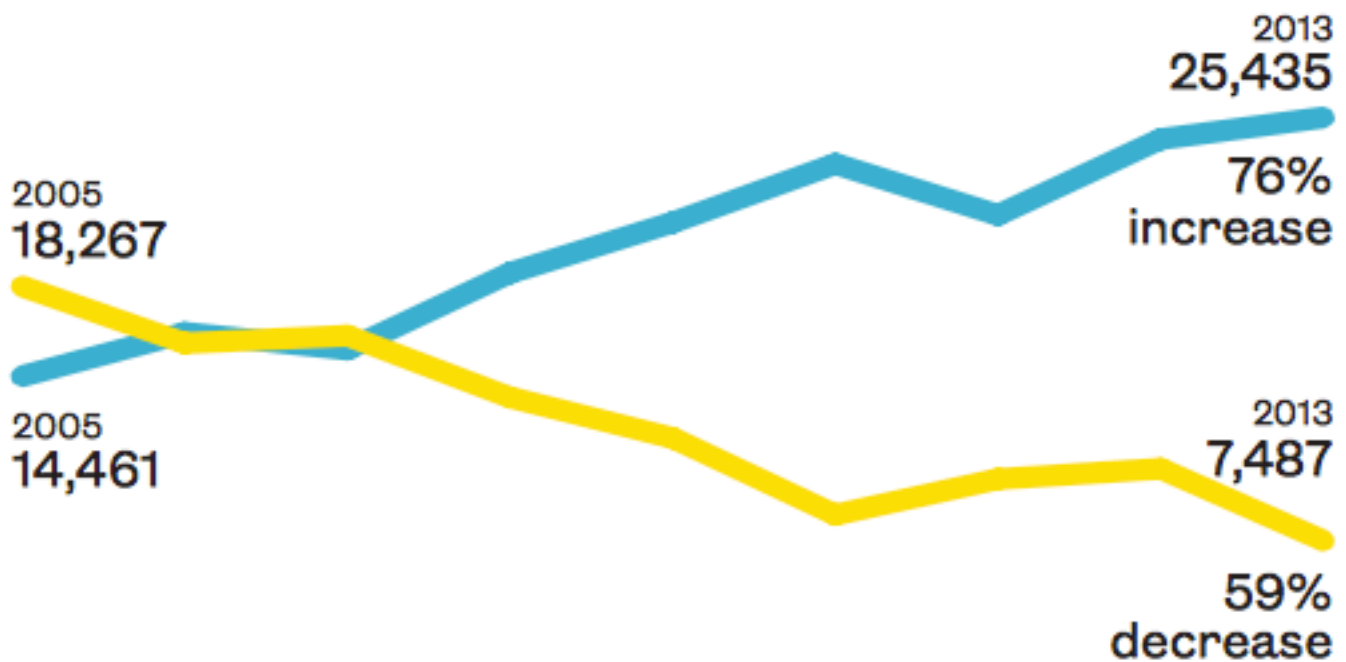

■ Less than \$1,000/month ■ \$1,000 or more/month

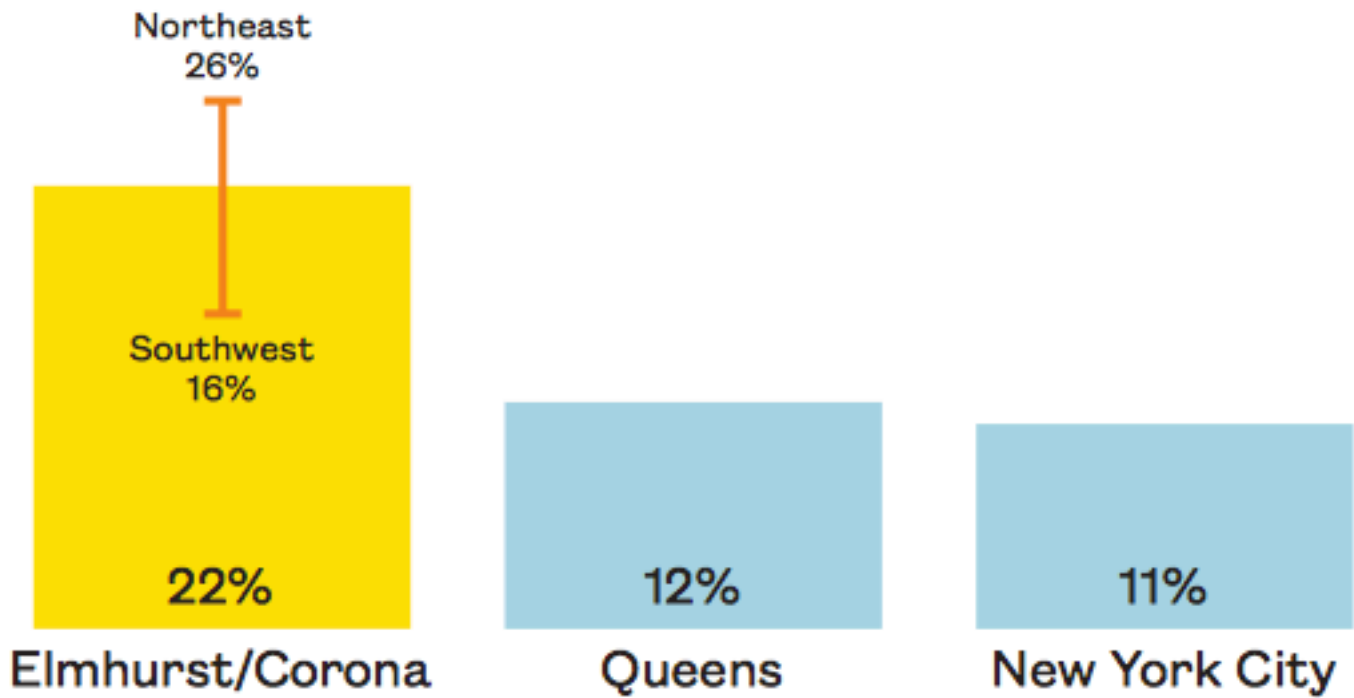

Overcrowding (2008–2012 Average)



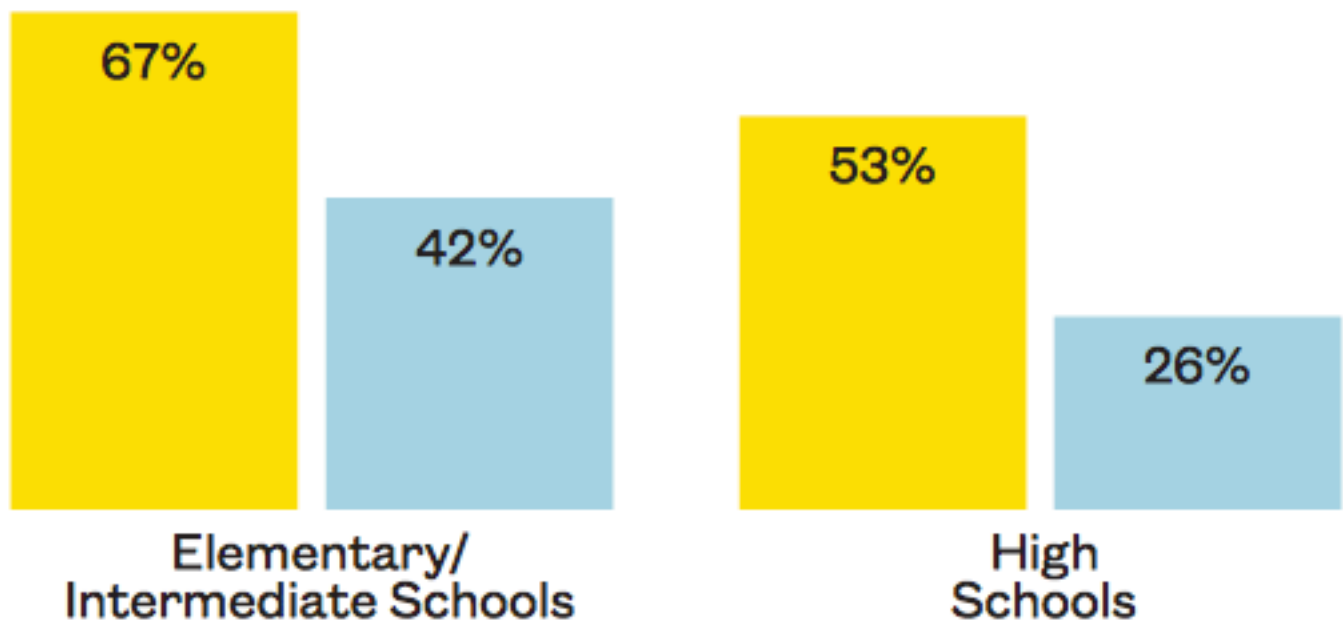

■ Elmhurst/Corona ■ New York City

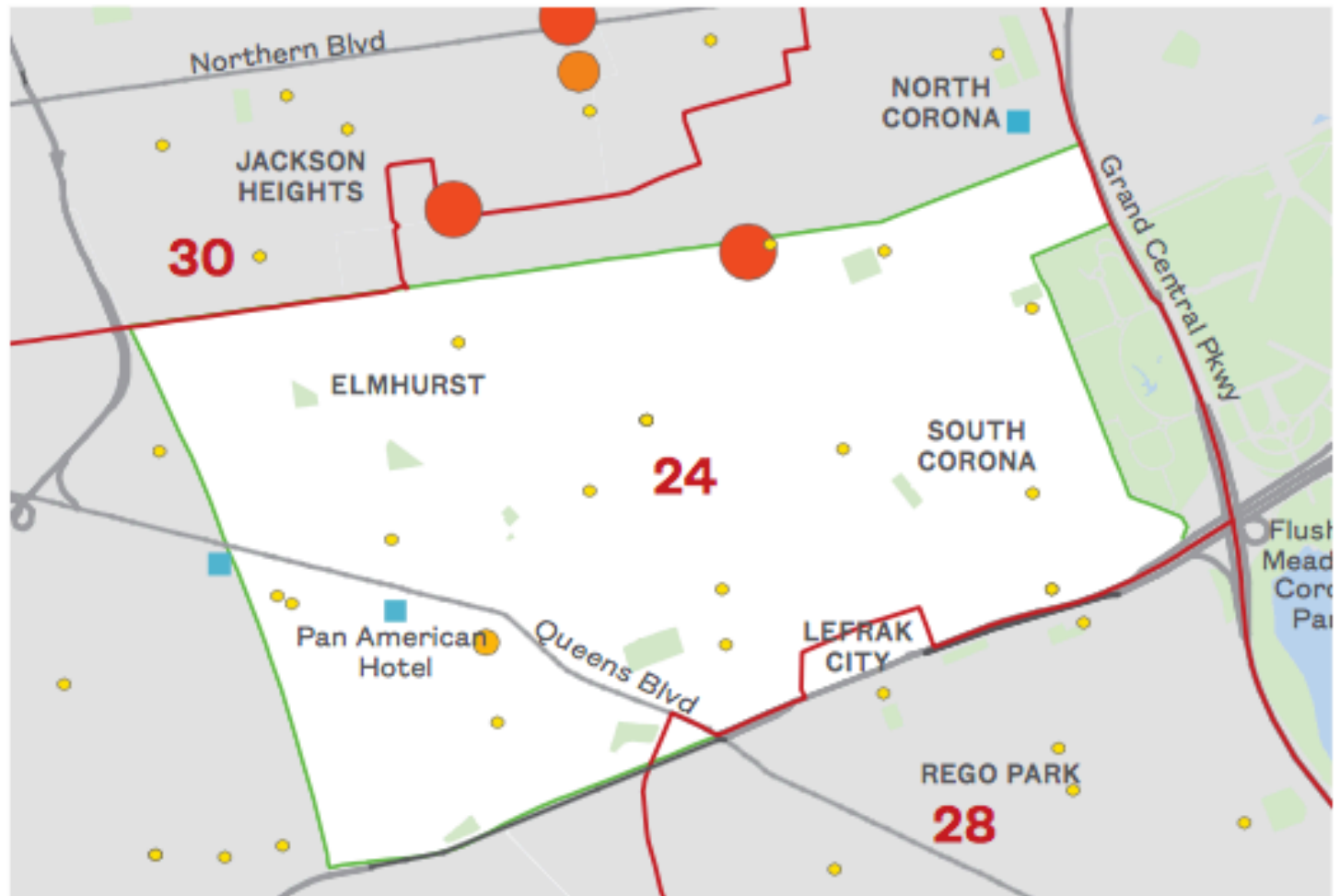
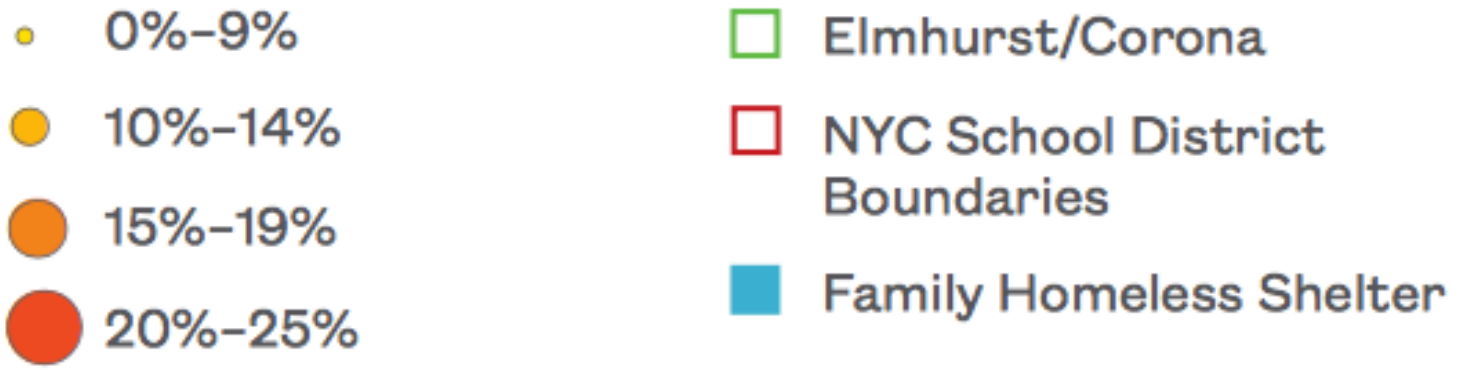
